The immature and weak new stratum corneum covering the healed incision allows too much water to evaporate, which signals excessive collagen production to "plug the leak," resulting in an abnormal scar.








BUNDLE

Include the cost of the item(s) in the supply charges for the procedures. You can add just the actual cost of the item(s) or cost + a markup (retail price)

MARKUP & SELL

Markup retail price similar to what you do for skincare items—usually doubling the cost of the product or more. Sell all products a la carte to patients.

NON-PROFIT

If your practice is part of a non-profit hospital affiliation, you may only be able to mark them up enough to cover all costs such as shipping & handling. Some doctors choose to charge the patient just for the cost of the product, especially for reconstruction, cancer, trauma and burn patients.
